By way of keeping order if the boys in any part of the church were making a noise he used to put (his? / List?) slippers over his boots, he was not heard approaching, he peeped over the top and admonished the noisy ones, if any one individual was particularly obstinate he walked him off to his own pew".

Richard Baker was the owner and occupier of Furzeffield House and of Potters Farm and Singers with their lands from some time before 1832 until 1851 (or after), he owned Chates in 1840. These properties he inherited from his uncle, Richard Baker of Cowfold. He surrendered Singers to Thos Wisden of Henfield in 1854 before his death later that year.

Married (being a farmer of Cowfold, bachelor, aged 21 and upwards) Elizabeth Wiston of Newick, spinster aged 21 and upwards. License 03.07.1833 for marriage at Newick.

Sometime after establishing himself James Farren (who married the daughter of King who was at Eastlands until the Sewage Farm was set up in West Field and who then moved to Itchingfield) had to move his forge from the Thornden site and re-established it at the site by Ellersleigh on Henfield Road. He also acquired and moved into the house by the churchyard gate. Later he also acquired Whitelined House opposite the Smithy. At this time (mid 1920's?) that building stood on a property with a large yard between it and the Red Lion. Dixon the butcher there, built a new house and shop, Palmerston House, on the yard and in dividing the property sold Whitelined House to James Farren or his son, Frederick James Farren, who converted it to use as a garage.

F J Farren married the daughter of Mr Knight, the baker, whose first entry on the Cowfold scene was at the bakery on Bolney Road, later Oliver's.

James Mobsby lived with father until aged about 12 – about Ladyday 1814 he was placed out by the parish officers as a poor boy belonging to the parish with Mr Pierce of Mockford farm as a plough boy for one year. Pierce continued the hiring of Mobsby to the end of the year and for two more years until Ladyday 1817 – the parish then hired Mobsby to Richard Baker, farmer, living in Cowfold street and who used Potters Farm – he was hired out as a groom for a year which he duly served as he did two years more. At Ladyday 1820 Mobsby (being so entitled to do) hired himself to Richard Baker as a groom for one year at wage of £4 with his clothes, board and lodging – he lived in Baker's house and received clothes when wanted and at the end of the year his wages – he continued another year with Baker under ½ yearly agreements. Married in Jan 1831 at Henfield and children were born (Caroline, William, James, Harriet, Ann, Samuel) – lived in Henfield for four years after marriage – became unable to pay his poor rate and went to Mr Boyce, then overseer in Cowfold, who gave him 2/6^d for the purpose. Since then had not applied for relief.

(Undated) press report on his death: Mr William Sprinks, who was for 31 years a member of the Cowfold Parish Council and 21 years a warden at St Peter's Church, died at his home on Sunday.

Mr Sprinks was 89 years of age and had retired from his business as a provision merchant some nine months ago. He was still a member of the Parish Council and a member of the Board of School Managers, although he had resigned his Churchwardenship last Easter owing to failing health.

He was treasurer of the local Hearts of Oak Society and had but recently resigned from his position as secretary of the Village Hall Slate Club.

Born at Arundel, Mr Sprinks came to Cowfold nearly 70 years ago starting his business shortly afterwards. Many residents found it hard to believe that he was the oldest inhabitant of Cowfold, for until recently he took a full and energetic part in local activities.

The funeral took place at Cowfold Parish Church on Wednesdayconducted by the Vicar, Rev W B Sandberg Personal estate (gross) £23,838.
